Making Space for Sand have previously helped us run plant identification workshops and we are working with them to ensure the developing Par Dunes are the best they can be. To further support our work in controlling invasive plant species in the dunes, in February they offered additional tools and equipment. Not only did they provide multiple hand tools and gloves/gauntlets but also a battery operated brush cutter, associated safety gear and training! Three FoPB members have already undertaken training and can now work to ensure the mid and lower dunes remain dynamic.

Over 60 people attended the **Love Your Beach** and Love Your Bay event at Par Beach on 11th February. Some photos will be available to view elsewhere but the sand art was spectacular!
